Athens State University Student Achievement Report

This report presents information to both internal and external constituencies regarding the success of Athens State University undergraduate students in meeting their academic, continuing education, and early career goals. The report is updated annually and is published on the University website. All tables in this report are based on data collected through the annual assessment cycle employing direct and indirect methodology.

Learning outcomes are formulated by each academic program and reflect students' success in achieving the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA) or other competencies as a result of having gone through the curriculum.

Outcomes measured through evidence-based methods may include degree-specific examinations, research projects, targeted assignments, licensing or certifications, capstone courses, and/or major field tests. Self-assessment of students' exiting competencies is used as a complementary method of evaluation. Information from graduates' employment and continuing education pursuits are collected every two years through the Graduate Follow-Up Survey.


